**Homeless** students are who do not have permanent and adequate homes.

**Chronic truants** are students who are absent from school without valid cause for 9 or more of the last 180 school days.

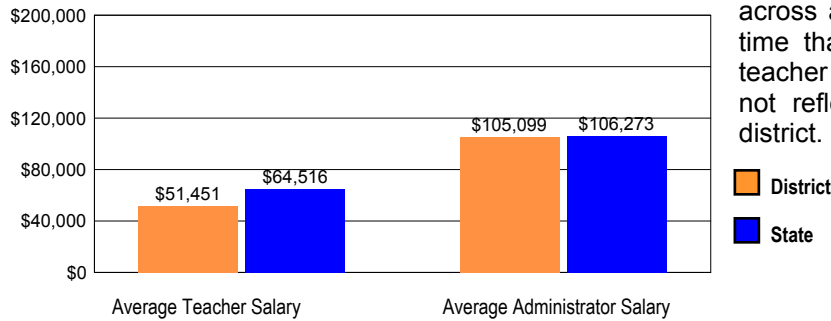

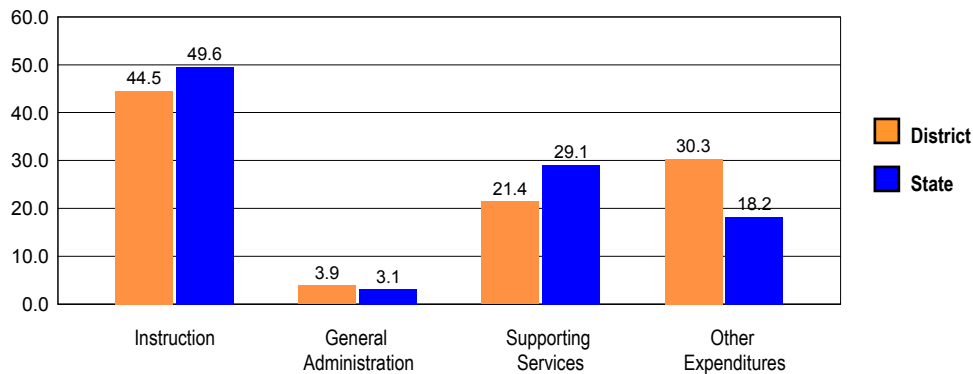

**Operating expenditure per pupil** includes the gross operating cost of a school district excluding summer school, adult education, bond principal retired, and capital expenditures.
