SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

1. Kindergarten Registration-Information Night Report

- The Kindergarten Round-up was once again, very well attended and well organized. Thanks to Mrs. Maher, the Kindergarten staff, and the support staff that helped to make it a great night. It has been determined that 125 students have already registered. The Board will be kept apprised of registration numbers throughout the s
- pring. Early indications are that enrollment will be at least 150 for Kindergarten, based on comparisons to the previous kindergarten registration numbers from the last few years. Also based on the 5-year trend of an increased enrollment overall in the district, expectations that our overall enrollment will see an increase, possibly reaching 1450 by the start of the year.

2. Registration – 2017-18 Status Report

• See Above – Online Registration for 2017-18 is currently open. Families can now register for the upcoming school year. As a reminder, the registration fees are discounted for those that register early. It is also possible to register and update information now, then pay fees at a later date.

3. 2017 State of the Schools Address at State of the Village

4. Award Contract for Custodial Services

- The bid opening for Custodial Services was held on March 1, 2017 at 10am. Three bids were submitted; GCA, ABMS, INC., and RNA. The bids were as follows:
 - o GCA \$331,327.00
 - o ABMS, INC. \$340,286.00
 - o RNA \$\$347,459.25

Superintendent reported that the district has been satisfied with the work GCA has done for the district over the last 5 years and therefore recommends to the Board to accept their low bid of \$331,327.00

D. Murphy made a motion to award the contract for custodial services for FY18 with the option for four one-year renewals, to GCA for the annual cost in FY18 of \$331,327.00 with a second by D. DeCaprio. All voted aye: S. Mancke, D. DeCaprio, D. Murphy, M. Gray, S. Prynn, J. Mitchell. Motion Carried.

5. Approve Copier Lease for FY18

- After receiving proposals from 5 copier companies, the Superintendent recommended approving entering into a new lease agreement with Proven. The current company is Choice. The projected cost for the current year is expected to total \$30,463. A new lease with Proven will cost \$29,469.88 based on 3.2 million copies produced.
- J. Mitchell made a motion to approve 3-year lease with Proven Business Systems, beginning FY18 with a second by M. Gray. All voted aye: S. Mancke, D. DeCaprio, D. Murphy, M. Gray, S. Prynn, and J. Mitchell. Motion Carried.

6. Approve Asphalt Resurface Bid

D. Murphy made a motion to accept the bid for Wilson Creek asphalt repair and resurfacing to Denler in the amount of \$20,300 with second by M. Gray. All voted aye: S. Mancke, D. DeCaprio, D. Murphy, M. Gray, S. Prynn, and J. Mitchell. Motion Carried.

7. 10-Year Life Safety Review

D. DeCaprio made a motion to approve 10-year Life Safety Review as submitted by the district architectural firm, STR with a second by S. Prynn. All voted aye: S. Mancke, D. DeCaprio, D. Murphy, M. Gray, S. Prynn, and J. Mitchell. Motion Carried.



Our April 12th meeting will be moved to Tuesday, April 18th at the same time, 7:00 pm. This new date is only for the April meeting.



The latest student assessment information from STAR and quarterly math assessments were shared with the Staff at Feb. Institute.


STAR Reading Data
